We are part of a Global Spiritan Mission which is represented in 56 countries. Here in Ireland our mission in education is governed by the Spiritan Education Trust (SET). Spirasi is our social justice project and has over 20 years' experience supporting migrants in Ireland who are victims of torture.

The first educational community of our founder Claude Poullart des Places was rooted in prayer, high standards of education and social outreach. Today Spiritan schools in Ireland are striving to follow this example. We are committed to providing our schools with opportunities to immerse themselves in the Spiritan ethos, at home and overseas. Spirasi, our 'mission' at home...

Spirasi serves migrants who fled torture and severe trauma. In the past 18 months alone, the organisation has seen a 25% increase in the number of people utilising its services across the country. Given that almost 50% of all those seeking asylum in Ireland have previously experienced torture, this number is not surprising. Spirasi is recognised by the HSE as the main provider of treatment for those who have these painful experiences. Service users are increasingly spread out across the country. We must spread too, to provide wider access to effective rehabilitation.



Our missionaries overseas, needed more than ever...

Our missionaries serve communities in areas of entrenched poverty and deprivation. We introduce impactful projects in areas in need of relief and development, and support the locals in sustaining them. Men like Fr. Pat Clarke (pictured right receiving Presidential Distinguished Service Award in 2019), continue to make an impact on the daily lives of the vulnerable.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, Father Pat and colleagues supplied food and medical provisions to those most in need in the shanty towns and 'favelas' in São Paulo, Brazil. This response has been in place since 24th March. Essential supplies have been given to over 12,500 families (50,000 people) in 35 deprived districts.

Brazil has been the worst affected country in South America during the pandemic, and it is also our largest mission.





OUR VISION FOR THE FUTURE



As a congregation we are always looking ahead, especially in our mission of addressing the needs of those vulnerable and poverty-stricken at home and abroad. We need your support in raising awareness of the work that we do.

To ensure that we provide leadership to future generations and serve those most in need, we are focused on two expressions of mission, which we believe reflect our ethos and values: **Spirasi** and **Overseas Mission.** Spirasi needs to meet the demand on its service regionally and our missionaries overseas are consistently challenged in the ability to financially sustain their mission. **As we are at a critical point in supporting these projects we have launched a campaign called** *'Of Service to Others'***.**

We remain committed to our schools as part of developing Spiritan mission, especially as they engage with the next generation of young adults. The work done in immersing students in our values enhances not only their lives but also the lives of those most in need. They will carry the legacy of our congregation into the future.
