



Supporting Survivors and their Families

Through its Safeguarding Office and through the Restorative Justice Process, the Spiritan Congregation wants to reach out to survivors and their families.

Support is available to those who make an allegation/disclosure of abuse - to assist, where appropriate, with communication between the person making an allegation/disclosure and the leadership of the Congregation, and also to the statutory authorities i.e. Gardaí and Tusla, the Child & Family Agency if that is requested.

Staff in the Safeguarding Office or the Restorative Justice Facilitators will:

- Provide information on the support services available.
- Work to identify your pastoral needs at this time in your life.
- Offer a 'listening ear' to you and your family.
- Liaise with Congregation on your behalf.
- Inform the Spiritan Congregation of your concerns, needs, fears and expectations should you so wish.
- Arrange, if considered helpful, a meeting with a representative of the Congregation.
- Represent your interests (anonymously) to the various safeguarding committees/ panels.
